

#### **5TH JAPAN FILM FESTIVAL OF SAN FRANCISCO September 1-10, 2017 at NEW PEOPLE Cinema**

**SAN FRANCISCO, August 1, 2017** – The 5th Annual JAPAN FILM FESTIVAL OF SAN FRANCISCO will be held at the NEW PEOPLE Cinema in September 1-10, 2017. Premiere screenings of the latest Japanese live-action and animation films, special appearances and Q&A sessions with filmmakers are planned. Also, the film festival will present the JFFSF Honorary Award 2017 to Actor and Director Kaori Momoi (*Memoirs of a Geisha, Ghost In the Shell*). The award ceremony will take place at the J-POP SUMMIT 2017 main stage at the Fort Mason Center For Arts & Culture on the second weekend, Saturday, September 9th at 2pm.

How about a battle with flowers instead of swords? It's 16th Century Japan's 'Age of Civil War,' and one man works with flowers to bring peace to the land. He is Senko Ikenobo, one of the "flower monks" of Rokkakudo Temple. Featuring more than 200 floral *ikebana* arrangements, the film was created with cooperation of Ikenobo school, and three major schools of tea in Japan.

When Futaba is suddenly diagnosed with a terminal illness, she decides to make use of her remaining time to revive the family's failing bathhouse business, and set Azumi on the path to independence.

#### LOVE AND GOODBYE AND HAWAII

Rinko (Ayu Ayano) has been living with her ex-boyfriend Isamu (Kentaro Tamura), a graduate student, for three years. They can't make up their minds, and their situation is too comfortable for Rinko to move out. One day, Rinko finds out that a young girl and Isamu are attracted to each other. Now, Rinko is faced with a tough decision.

# **THE PROJECTS**

Directed by Junji Sakamoto with his diverse filmmaking styles, the offbeat dialoguedriven drama unfolds when a couple, Hinako (Naomi Fujiyama) and Seiji (Ittoku Kishibe), close their Chinese medicine shop on a shopping strip and relocate to a housing project. Their dejected vibe rouses the curiosity of their neighbors, and then suddenly Seiji vanishes. Speculation takes root that Hinako has murdered Seiji.

## **NAPPING PRINCESS**

Masterful anime director Kenji Kamiyama's (*Ghost in the Shell: Stand Alone Complex, Jin Roh: The Wolf Brigade*) genre-bending adventure is set in the not-too-distant machine-driven future, in which a young woman Kokone is having strange dreams of warring machines, hinting at long-dormant family secrets. *Napping Princess* has all the features of the best anime films, expertly layering its narrative to fuse two worlds that appear separate on the surface.

# **Cinema Kabuki:** *RENJISHI* and *RAKUDA* (Double Feature) (US Premiere)

# RENJISHI (The Father and Son Shishi Lions, 55min)

The Kabuki Lion Dance usually features a father/son duo as two powerful lions that explore the challenging father/son relationship. The Triple Lion Dance is extraordinary not only because it stars the legendary actor Kanzaburo, but also his sons Kankuro and Shichinosuke who shine as the younger lions, showcasing three of Japan's most revered mythical beasts. The father lion is one of the most sought-after roles for Kabuki actors.

# RAKUDA (The Camel, 52min)

When unpopular tenant Uma dies, his only friend Hanji schemes to make some money. He sends Kyuroku, the junk collector, to demand support for the funeral ceremony from Uma's miserly landlord – or the dead Uma will come to his house and dance. Kabuki's most powerful acting duo lights a fire under this black comedy, which turns to hilarious farce with the aid of copious amounts of sake.

# THE TOKYO NIGHT SKY IS ALWAYS THE DENSEST SHADE OF BLUE

Written and directed by Yuya Ishii (*Sawako Decides, The Great Passage, Our Family, The Vancouver Asahi*), the film that premiered at Berlin Film Festival this year was inspired by poetry written by Japan's rising poet Tahi Saihate. In a subtle accumulation of details, the film follows two young misfits in Tokyo, Mika (Shizuka

Ishibashi) and Shinji (Sosuke Ikematsu), from their first encounter through trust forming in one another.

#### MY DAD AND MR. ITO

Based on a popular novel, this film by Director Yuki Tanada depicts a carefree woman living under the same roof with her father and her boyfriend twenty years her senior. Aya (Juri Ueno) spends her days as she pleases living in an elderly home with her older boyfriend Mr. Ito (Lily Franky). Her peaceful days are upended when her father (Tatsuya Fuji) shows up after getting kicked out of his son's home.

#### **CLOSE-KNIT**

The first film in five years from Director Naoko Ogigami (*Kamome Diner*) depicts a man who became a woman, her partner and young niece. Tomo (Rinka Kakihara) is a girl who moves in with her uncle Makio (Kenta Kiritani) after her mom takes off. Makio's lover Rinko (Toma Ikuta) is a former man. Tomo feels confused, but gets her first taste of a loving household.
